Jesus' Proven Principles and Practices

- Mobilize Prayer. Sow broadly. Filter ripe fruit. Select. Go 2 by 2. Debrief. Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. Love people
- Look for leaders (who take initiative and have others following them). Resist the urge to commit to a discipleship relationship too soon!
- Each step is significant for the disciple (= learner) being developed and strategic for reaching the world.
- Discipler's role: Intercede, rebuke, correct, encourage, train, release.
 - Disciple's role: Truly Following Jesus.
- As a rule, use God's Word on each appointment to build conviction.
- Know the difference between forming growth groups & making disciples. (through **selection** based on faithfulness, availability and teachability) on God alone causes the growth. Over time we must focus our attention
 - 4th soil disciples who are able and willing to become spiritual multipliers. Remember this is a PROCESS - making disciples takes time.
- As the movement grows, keep it CHRIST-CENTERED and STUDENT-LED!

Be connected to the Cru community and be a team player

- Attend Cru meetings on a regular basis (Wednesdays at 8:30)
- · Attend Fall Retreat and Winter Conference
- · Become familiar with and use Cru Materials (Knowing God Personally, Satisfied, Soularium, etc.)

Be involved in reaching students for Christ

- · Willing to be trained and practice initiative evangelism
- · Commit to help start a movement

- Commit to follow up with students from various outreaches

Be invested in community, so you can walk with Christ and invest in others

- Be a part of a small group (growing in the Word, prayer, love for Christ, humility...)
- $\cdot\,$ Attend the leadership retreat before school starts in August and Leadership Meetings (every 3 weeks on Sundays 6-7:30)
- Attend training opportunities.
- · Actively bring and invite others into the Cru community.

Training for New Leaders this semester:

- · Attend the two training times on these dates: March 22 and March 29 from 7-8pm
- · Go on campus with a student leader or staff to learn and observe how to share your faith
